Coins and Money

DIRECTIONS: Create a card for each line. Cards should have coin stickers or stamps. Student “reads” the correct coins to answer the question, then reads the question on the card to keep the game going. The round ends when the question comes back to the answer on the first card.

I have 4 dimes. Who has 27 cents?

I have a quarter and 2 pennies. Who has 13 cents?

I have a dime and 3 pennies. Who has 32 cents?

I have a quarter, a nickel and 2 pennies. Who has 8 cents?

I have a nickel and 3 pennies. Who has 50 cents?

I have 2 quarters. Who has 37 cents?

I have 3 dimes, 1 nickel and 2 pennies. Who has 21 cents?

I have 4 nickels and 1 penny. Who has 45 cents?

I have a quarter and 2 dimes. Who has 18 cents?

I have 3 nickels and 3 pennies. Who has 5 cents?

I have one nickel. Who has 55 cents?

I have 2 quarters and a nickel. Who has 15 cents?

I have one dime and one nickel. Who has 4 cents?

I have 4 pennies. Who has 30 cents?

I have 3 dimes. Who has 16 cents?

I have a dime, a nickel and a penny. Who has 25 cents?

I have one quarter. Who has 42 cents?

I have one quarter, one dime, one nickel and 2 pennies. Who has 60 cents?

I have 2 quarters and 2 nickels. Who has 10 cents?
